# Rotating With a Purpose

- What does that mean to you?
- Rotations should be done on purpose and with a purpose
- Hustle to your spot
- Be Decisive

# Why Do We Rotate?

- We rotate to put our crew in the best position to officiate
- Rotating allows each official to focus on their Primary Coverage Area (PCA)
- Rotating properly reduces missed calls



# When Do I Rotate

- When should we rotate?
- Ray Lutz would say “If you looking over there, the ball is over there, and most of the offense is over there rotate.
- True or false: The Lead official always initiates the rotation?

# When Do I Rotate

- Answer: False - The lead official usually initiates the rotation but sometimes a closely guarded count by the center official may initiate the rotation.
- Competitive match-ups are good indicators to rotate
